All honey exhibited must have been gathered and ripened in a natural way by honeybees.

No exhibitor's name or label will be allowed on any entry.

Competent judging will be provided. Judged may withhold prizes for insufficient merit.

Any exhibitor who wishes information as to how his/her entry was placed by the judge can receive this information by consulting with the chairman of the honey exhibits. A copy of the Standards for Honey Judging in Maryland will be available on request.

Do not use adhesive seals or fliptop lids.
